



European Species Championship 2026 Dalvik August 2026. Newsletter no. 1.

The European Species Championship 2026 will be held from Dalvik, North-Iceland from 27th August to 30th August. EFSA Iceland will not issue a brochure for the Championship but instead issue a regular Newsletter and send it out to all the Sections and publish it on EFSA Iceland and EFSA HQ websites, www.efsa.is/, <http://efsa.fishing.org> and on Facebook.

Information

Entry fee and closing date of entry. Entry fee is EUR 400. Bait included. **Pre-Registration before 1st April 2026 and payment of entry fee before 31st May 2026.** Price for Gala Dinner is EUR 50. The entry form will be sent out on a Word-format and a PDF-format.

The rate of exchange. On 22nd of January 2026 the rate of exchange for the Icelandic krona was approx. 1 € = 146 ISK krona and 1 £ Sterling = 167 ISK krona.

The fishing spots. We will be fishing from the fishing grounds near Dalvik and in bay of Eyjafjordur.

Fishing rules. See below.

Fish to catch. Cod. Other fish do not count for points.

The fishing. All the good size **fish must be killed by bleeding**. You will be provided with a bucket for your fish. The skipper will bleed the fish, the Crew measure and the Boat captain or his Steward writes down on the Scorecard. After that put the fish into the common box. If you have got a record fish or if it is your personal record, you can tag it, keep it with you and bring it in for measuring. We may not by law release a fish back into the water, so all fish into the common box.

Bait. We will use Herring and/or Mackerel.

Teams. It is free of charge to register into teams. Your Secretary will register your Section's teams in due course. See registration cards below.

Tackle shop. There is a tackle shop in Akureyri "Veidirikid" Óseyri 6. <https://veidirikid.is/>

Clothing. It can be cold and windy in August in Iceland. Bring with you your warm clothes, rain clothes and boots.

Spouse tour. There will be no spouse tour organized by the Organizing Committee. But there are many places near Dalvik worth visiting.

EFSA uniform. You must wear EFSA uniform at the Opening Ceremony, the Prize giving Ceremony and the Gala dinner.

Dear fellow anglers and friends.

For the first time EFSA Iceland welcome you to the European Species Championship in August 2026 in Dalvik, North-Iceland. This Championship was scheduled to be held in Sweden in September, but EFSA Sweden had to cancel their Species Championship due to uncontrollable reason.

EFSA Iceland has held one European Championships before in Dalvik or the European Boat & Line Championships in 2010. We have also held before one other Boat & Line Championships, two Shore Championships and three Species Championships from Olafsvik, Akureyri and The Westman Islands.

In this European Species Championship, we will be targeting big Cod and fish from the fishing grounds near Dalvik and the bay of Eyjafjördur. The fishing is unlimited. The point system is divided into three length categories: Cod 50 cm to 74 cm, Cod 75 cm to 89 cm and Cod 90 cm and over.

The weather in Iceland in August can be windy and cold so remember to bring with you some warm cloths and boots. In most weather conditions we can seek shelter between the island of Hrisey and the mainland in the bay of Eyjafjordur.

I am sure that you will enjoy your stay in Iceland and in Dalvik and I and all our members look very much forward to see you.



Point system, boats, fishing gear, fishing technique

The point system and fishing. The Championship is a Species Championship with **unlimited number** of Cod to count for points. Cod 50-74 cm 1 points, Cod 75-89 cm 4 points and Cod 90 cm or longer 20 points. All other fish 0 point.

Boats. The boats in the Championship will mainly be small size fibre plastic fishing boats. Experienced skippers on each boat know where to catch the fish. The skipper can net/gaff the fish for the anglers if requested and they will gill all fish for the anglers. They can be of help in all troubles for example tangled lines or breaking the line, but they never bait the hooks for anglers or touch the rod when the trace is down.

The boats will be drifting all day when fishing.




Fishing. Gear and technique.

In the EFSA Species Championship, we will be fishing similar as in other EFSA Championships and with strong rods and reels. Bait will be supplied by the organizers, and no other bait is allowed other than caught by the angler that day.

Fishing will mainly be on baited traces, paternoster or similar. Pirk and artificial lures can also be used. Pirk can sometimes be useful for an experienced angler.

Please just keep in mind, have the fish netted/gaffed when brought to the surface or try lifting the fish by getting hold of the line and bring it in carefully that way. Please do not lift the fish on board with the rod. If the fish in the process falls off the trace or the pirk it can cause severe personal damage.



Examples of common traces

Lead can be bought from EFSA Iceland at the Championship but notice there is no tackle shop in Dalvik but there is one in Akureyri. The weather condition in August can be cold and windy with heavy sea, so it is necessary to bring warm cloths and glove and rubber boots. Especially we recommend waterproof pants and jackets or anoraks.

Championship Rules 2026 Dalvik Iceland

General Fishing RULES

1. The Championship will be fished to the EFSA rules governing at the time of the Championship unless otherwise stated.
2. The fishing will take place the 28th and 29th of August 2026. 30th to spare if weather is bad on 28th or 29th.
3. The boat draw will take place in public at least one month before the Championship.
4. A husband and wife, parent and child may apply to be drawn on the same boat but a request to do so must be clearly stated on the entry form.
5. Fishing captain will be appointed for each boat and his duties will include: Ensuring that the Championship rules are obeyed. Responsible for drawing of places on board the boat. Observance of start and finish times. Complete the "Fish record card" for the anglers Liaising with the boat skipper.
6. Fishing area each day will be directed by the Organizing Committee who will be guided by prevailing weather conditions.
7. The Committee has the power to abandon that day's fishing or confine all boats to safe area. The Committee's decision will be final.
8. Bait will be supplied to each angler at the boat before each day's fishing. The only other bait allowed will be that caught by the competitor that day. Bait or baitfish may not be retained at the end of each day. Bait may not be shared.
9. Artificial lures are permitted.
10. Anglers may receive assistance to net or gaff a fish.
11. A fish counting shall immediately be gilled and it is not permitted to start fishing again until it has been done.
12. A foul hooked Cod does not count and shall immediately be put in a common container aboard the boat.
13. Casting from a boat is only permitted using an under arm method with the terminal tackle and trace outside the boat at all times during the cast.
14. Only one trace at a time is permitted. Maximum of two hooks is permitted on a trace. One of the hooks can be double or treble hook but must then be assembled to a pirk. Double or treble hooks may never be baited. Length of a trace should not exceed 4.5 meters.
15. Lifting a fish and bring it aboard with the rod is not permitted.
16. Skipper or Boat Captain may:
 - a) Assist with gilling a fish.
 - b) Help anglers with mixed or tangled lines.
 - c) Gaff or net fish.
 - d) Break the line for anglers in case of the trace being stuck on the bottom.
 - e) Retrieving hooks from fish.
17. Skipper or Boat Captain may not:
 - a) Touch the angler's rod when the tackle is down except when trace is stuck on bottom.
 - b) Bait the hooks for anglers.
18. Only fish recorded on an angler's "Fish Record Card" count for points.
19. All anglers shall assemble at the harbour at 06:30 each day. Boats can leave harbour at 07:00. Lines down at 08:00. Lines up latest at 14:00. Boats shall be in harbour no later than 16:00 hour. If boats arrive at fishing grounds before starting time and all anglers are ready it's permitted to start fishing. Then the lines shall be up after exactly six hours.
20. Boats shall contact Organizing Committee immediately in case of a breakdown. The Organizing Committee decides if an extra fishing time is granted in each case.
21. Fish points are given by point system shown on the Scorecard. It is a part of the rules.
22. Each angler is responsible for checking that his/her catch is correctly entered on the Scorecard.
23. The Boat Winner each day will get 100 boat points and the other anglers will have their boat scores expressed as a percentage of the Boat Winner's score.
24. In case of a tie the angler with most fishing point will win. If two or more anglers are still equal the angler with fewer fish shall win.
25. Results will be published on a scoreboard at the Headquarters before 19:00 each day.
26. Any claim regarding a day's fishing shall be brought to the Organizing Committee no later than 17:00 that day.
27. Any claim regarding a day's result shall be brought to the Organizing Committee soonest possible, no later than 08:00 the following day.
28. Point system. Cod 50-74 cm. long 1 points, Cod 75-89 cm. long 4 points, Cod 90 cm or longer 20 points. All other fish 0 point. Unlimited fishing.
